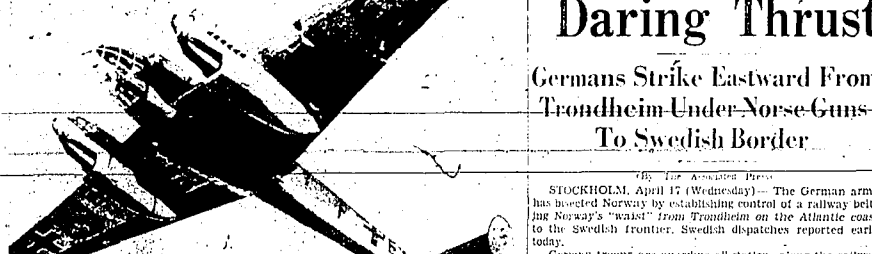

### RUMANIA'S NAVY NOW RULES PORTS

Nation Prepares for War Under Combined Soviet, Nazi Threat

BUCHAREST, April 16 (AP)—Rumania moved to pier her Black sea and Danube ports under navy rule tonight as the first step in an extensive program to prepare the country for the possibility of war.

With units of the Soviet war reported at Odessa and Nazi gunboats ready to dash down the Danube, General Paul Tudorosan, minister of navy and air, introduced a bill in the Rumanian chamber giving the government immediate power to take "extraordinary military measures" in all ports and territorial waters.

At the same time "strategic" factories working for national defense were ordered to immediately build up a 15-day emergency supply of coal and fuel oil which may be touched and used in any case of mobilization. The government also specified that all defense factories must immediately construct extensive underground storage tanks.

The Tudorosan bill is the latest in a series of swift government measures. Others banned the export of wheat, flour, and other food shipments out of the country, and ordered foreign oil companies to deliver their supplies on a strictly cash basis, as royalties, in lieu of cash.

The bill means that British and French producers will contribute 70 per cent of at least 35,000 tons of oil which will be used by the government in royalties for the seven months ending April 30.

This quantity is believed to be sufficient not only for the immediate needs of Rumania's army and railroads but also for a surplus.

In an effort to cut internal consumption of oil products, the government was forced to announce that it is planning a tax of from 50 to 75 per cent on gasoline sales.

It was expected that all private automobiles would be restricted and banned on Sundays.

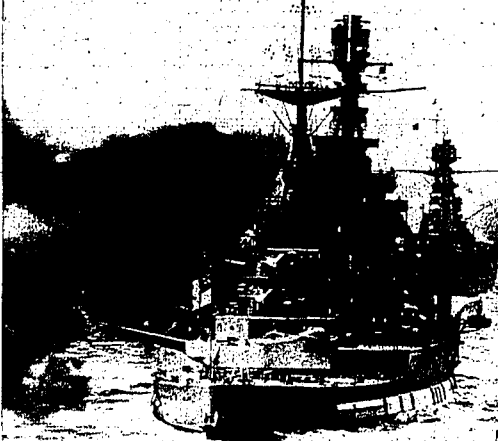

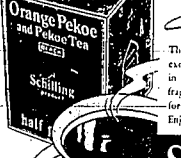
