

In view of these conditions, has anyone a right to criticize the hospital staff for the way the institution is being operated? Intit it more reasonable to believe that the public is responsible for these over-crowded conditions because it has failed to provide a hospital staff community. COST OF BAD ROADS

Half of our street and highway accidents are caused not by the people but the roads, says Charles M. Upham, engineer-director of the American Road Builders Association. That means fifty deaths out of the daily average of 100. And fifty times 365 is more than 18,000. Better roads, then, might save link many a year.

We have built a great mileage of good roads, he admits, but there are still too many of the old, rough, narrow, Madly pawed roads. And while automobiles have accelerated their speed from twenty miles an hour to forty and sixty miles. The roadway has not kept pace, when the roads are as good as the cars, we shall be far after.

MORE ACCIDENTS

City and state safety council managers, studying figures dealing with automobile accidents of art in 1940, have issued a warning to traffic authorities, which should be passed along to every person who thes streets and highways as pedestrian or motorist. A "general upward trend" in traffic fatalities has appeared in the first quarter of this year. It is surprising news in view of the great gains in safety made by a number of cities. It indicates greater carelessness in the rest of the country. Wherever traffic accidents and deaths are reduced in number, the improvement has been credited to the continued and positive work of traffic authorities with the cooperation of newspapers, public schools and other local groups. It has proved the practical value of combining law enforcement and traffic education. Other communities could do as well if they were willing to tackle the jobs seriously.






