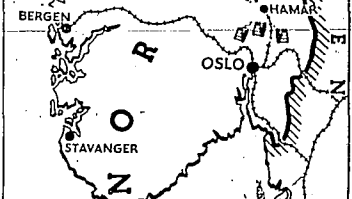

TAXES CURTAIL POWER REVENUE

Idaho Corporation Earnings Increase, Net Income Declines

BOISE, May 7.—The Idaho Power company's gross operating revenues increased \$402,100 during 1929, or 7 per cent, but net income declined \$171,200, or 25 per cent. C. J. Strick, vice president and general manager of the company, reported today.

Operating revenues for 1929 totaled \$5,127,874, compared with \$5,522,814 in 1928. The net income for 1929 was \$1,612,730, compared with \$1,783,930 for 1928.

The company has approximately 360 full-time employees and had last year's payroll totaled \$1,622,310. Its assets total \$47,802,470.

He said the annual report showed that the company's taxes in 1929 increased \$287,250, or 25 per cent, over the previous year, and commented:

"The tremendous increase in taxes makes Idaho Power company the highest taxed utility in the United States, so far as we are able to determine. Taxes in 1929 required more than 24 cents out of every dollar of gross operating revenues, or 25 per cent, more than \$1.60 for each of the 1929 regular employees. This total tax bill of \$1,513,013, or 25 per cent of the company's total operating payroll of more than \$6,000,000.

"The company's operating payroll increased \$75,000, or 7 per cent, largely from the establishment of a 40-hour week-week for all employees, Strick said.

"The increase in other operating expenses and provision for property retirement totaling \$119,935 reflects the normal increase in depreciation on the company's expanded operations.

"Idaho Power company was organized in 1916 and has since its establishment been providing electric service to southern Idaho and eastern Oregon.

"During the 12 years electric service has been brought to every town in the community, and to more than 72 per cent of the farms located in what has been the electric territory within or contiguous to the company's territory. This rural electrification is approximately three times the national average.

"The average annual kilowatt hour consumption of domestic customers in 1929 was 1,854 kilowatt hours, more than twice the national average. The average domestic rate was reduced to 2 cents per kilowatt hour, approximately one-third lower than the national average.

"During 1929 the company continued its program of necessary construction, including 310 miles of new rural lines.

New substations were built at Caldwell, Buhl, Gooding and Mullan, a new service building was built in Boise.

"I think my record supports my promise. In addition, I have now had valuable experience in the business of state government.

"It is my sole purpose to give the most efficient and economical service within my general office jurisdiction and with confidence bestowed upon me by the people of Idaho.

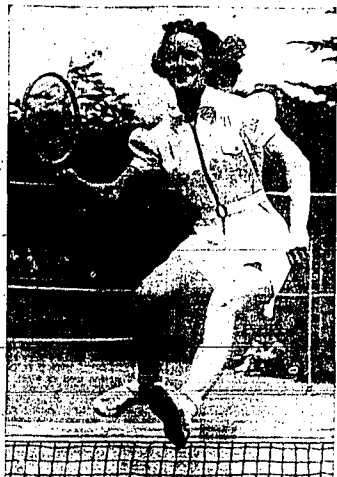

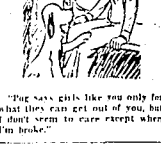
