

Germany announced today (Priday) that she was taking The Netherlands and Belgium under protection and was moving with all her forces to forestall an "immediate" British - French offensive through the low countries toward the rich reich industrial region of the Rubr.

Luxerbourg also was included in the German measures. Radio reports said German parachute troops already had landed The Netherlands and had encountered opposition in numerous

places.
