CONDENCED BOY REACHES PRISON

Clifford Zipse Regrets Failure to Testify in Own Behalf

BOISE, May 11—Sixteen-year-old Clifford Zipse, confessed murderer, expressed regret for his arrival tonight at the Idaho state penitentiary as he had not testified in his own behalf at his trial in Grassieville.

His defense was confined to a statement by an attorney named to represent him. When asked to read the statement and if it didn't bring him a trial I had broken down. I wish now I had, even though I'm in jail today.

He was brought to Boise by prison warden P. C. Merrill and Ed Wilkinson, assistant parole officer.

Zipse, fatherless since he was six years old and the only son of a merchant who died in the war, was reared with the inmate parents from an Idaho county truck farm, born in Tule, he said, in 1925, from Springfield, Colo., with his mother and the other of three boys of whom are married.

Two of his brothers are married; one, 13 years of age, lives with his mother, who lives on a 15-acre canyon ranch nine miles out of Grassieville.

Warden Merrill said one man was brought in to see the boy off. The lad, who said he left the Idaho county jail wearing a big cowboy hat.

He was courted May 7 to shoot to death with a high-powered rifle. In a confession, Zipse related he fired first at the Curtis boy at 400 yards with a high-powered rifle and hit him. When the other man started writing, he said, he was compelled by Curtis' groans to step into the arena and shoot the wounded boy to death, stop his suffering.

The jury recommended that he be hanged, and District Judge Allen E. Johnson of Lewiston recommended by state law to impose the death penalty, despite the boy's tender years.

Already, however, officials have set in motion a movement to have his case commuted to life imprisonment by the state pardon board.

JURIST FIGURES IN SENATE RACE

Political Observers Discuss Justice Budge as Possible Entry

TWIN FALLS, May 11.—Will Justice Alfred Budge, dean of the Idaho supreme court, enter the race for the Republican nomination for United States senator? Is a question political observers are asking.

Talk along these lines started months ago, but the kindly veteran judge abandoned inquiries with a smile and a negative wag of the head.

Asked again today if there was any significance to the fact that prominent figures from all parts of the state were heading a path to his door, he hinted there might be by pointing to a stack of letters urging him to make the race in the primary against Senator John Thomas of Gooding and Edwin Dulany of Pocatello, already avowed candidates.

Justice Budge, who appears to be years younger than his 72, was born in Providence, Utah, and has spent most of his life in public office. In the days when Idaho had district attorneys, he represented the fifth district; later he was prosecuting attorney of Bear Lake county, and then he served 12 years as judge of the fifth district, resigning to accept an appointment to the supreme court bench where he has represented continuously since 1914.

He was reelected in 1926 for a six-year term and would not be required to resign if he decided to seek the senatorial nomination.

A staid figure with a broad acquaintance in very part of Idaho, Justice Budge—in days before the states non-political judiciary has been active in the Republican party.

Eyes on Convention
Democratic political eyes turned this week toward Twin Falls where the party's state delegate convention will be staged May 16.

The event is the same as staged by the Republicans at Lewiston May 6.

The Twin Falls affair will be touched off the night before, on May 15, by Paul V. McNutt, candidate for the Democratic nomination for president.

The real fight of the convocate at Twin Falls, observers predict, will be over election of a national committee man.
