# Nazi Thrusts Rip Holland, Hit Belgium Hard Fighting Lowland Men and

British-French Allies Fall **Back on Long Front** 

Germany's hard-driving: armies plunged one hand deep toward the vitals of The Netherlands and mother into the heart of the Belgian defense last night while pushing the men of the two low countries and their British-French allies back along the far-flung battle front from the Znyder Zee to France.

But the allies, pledged to "victory at all costs," were massing their men in anticipation of a gigantic battle for which the present mighty conflict is only a pre-liminary skirmishing.

The Dutch removed their government from The Hague to an unidentified place as the high command gravely reported that the Germans had broken through part of their main defense line and also passed Moerdijk bridge across Hollandsch diep on the sea coast about 15 Biles south of enbattled Rotterdam.

The Nazis reported this thrust had made contact with the parachute troops previously dropped around


