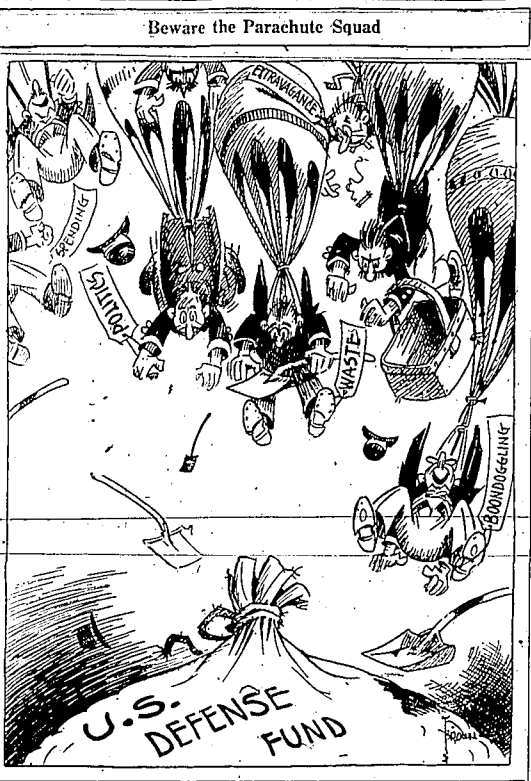

WILBUR SHAW WINS IN '500'

Veteran King of Speedways Wins Rex Mays

Dapper Indianapolis Pilot Scores Third Victory With 114:277 MPH Average; Sprinkles of Rain Slow Pace

INDIANAPOLIS, May 30 (AP)—Dapper Wilbur Shaw of Indianapolis drove today to his third triumph in the Indianapolis "500," breaking over Rex Mays of Glendale, Calif., by 2 1/2 miles in the 28th annual motor speedway race, the pace of which was slowed by sprinkles of rain.

Shaw became the second driver in the history of the speedway classic to win three times and the first ever to win twice in succession. Louis Meyer of Huntington Park, Calif., who retired after last year's race, is the only other previous three-time winner.

The 31-year-old Shaw, who first triumphed in 1927 and repeated in 1928, piloted his shark-nosed eight-cylinder Italian car at an average 114:277 mph on the 100-mile 114:277 mph race, far below the record of 117,000 mph established by the late Floyd Roberts in 1926. Driving the entire 500 miles, Shaw made only two quick stops for gasoline and tire changes. Shaw possibly could have mastered the 100-mile race if it had not been for the distance if he had not called. He had cracked the record at 300 and 400 miles.

Drivers Calmed
Because of a sprinkling rain, the drivers were forced to reduce their speed for the last 125 miles. After Shaw rode across the finish line in triumph officials hung out the red flag calling the race off the track.

Hurt Ross of Columbus, O., won third place behind Mays, and Ted Horn of Hawthorne, N. J., was fourth.

Three accidents, none of which were fatal, resulted in the loss of 100 miles had been relieved off.

The first crashup injured Larry Hurt of Columbus, Ohio, South American driving champion. The Argentine crashed into an inner guard rail on the southern side of the track and was tearing along on his 60th mile. His car was about 1/2 mile behind Mays, and the driver was pinned against the inner wall, adding scores to the track and hit the trees.

The veteran Ralph Hebert of Alton, Mo., also brought his car to a stop. Duke Dalek of Chicago drove only a few minutes before his crankshaft broke and when his car spun off the track after it had covered 22 miles.

Shaw won more than \$30,000. He drove the 500-mile race in 100:00:00, 100:00:00, and \$10,000 in cash awards from automobile manufacturers.

The Flying Hooter overhauled Mays, who set the early pace, on the 85th mile and took the lead after 100 miles.

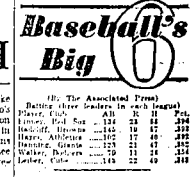

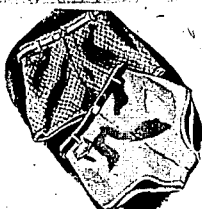
