Sun Valley Meeting to Vote on Spring Football Practice

SUN VALLEY, Idaho, June 10 (AP)—Spring football practice, regarded in some quarters as an athletic evil, will go on trial before a Pacific coast conference "jury" probably tomorrow.

Representatives of the 10-school organization, here for their annual summer meeting, have placed the matter of off-season practice high on their agenda. It will be discussed by members of the conference's three units, faculty men, graduate managers and coaches.

The football coaches themselves, naturally, are opposed to discontinuing spring training, which they claim serves an important adjunct to their program.

They have set their opposition on the matter of putting their newest student members, graduates of the freshmen tournament during the spring, to preliminary training designed to prepare them for the varsity grind a few months later.

Coaches of regular spring sports, notably track and field and basketball, are vigorously opposed to football practice in their seasons. They claim it deprives them of athletes who are needed for their own sports.

While spring training is not expected to be abolished completely, there was some speculation here tonight as to whether the conference would not reduce the time allotted to it. The present maximum limit is 30 practice sessions.

Some coaches claim that athletes are another problem due to be ironed out. The present rate of pay is \$10 a week, but the reduction in the hourly wage scale is to be proposed. It is an outline of the matter.

An overhauling of "recruiting rules" is also being considered. The conference probably will be attempted. The regulations have been under review for some time.
