The Indiana boin utilities executive, who has fought the new deal up hill and down dale for years, surged into the convention with 105 votes on the first ballot, gained by hig jumps on each succeeding roll call until the nomination was his.

We own and maintain quite a few islands in the same general region, to help safeguard the Canal. And that is all right.

We also have the Hawaidian Islands, a couple of thousand miles out in the Pacific, which are valuable and beautiful and productive, and serve as a defensive military front on our western flank, and that is all right.

But beyond that lie the broad western Paci-


