LET'S FORGET PARKING METERS

It is interesting to note that the city council has had this arrangement worked out with the possible exception of complaints from chronic violators, that the agitation for parking meters had been almost forgotten.

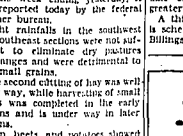

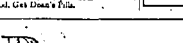

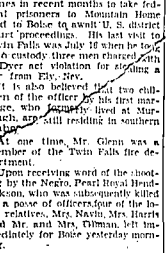
