

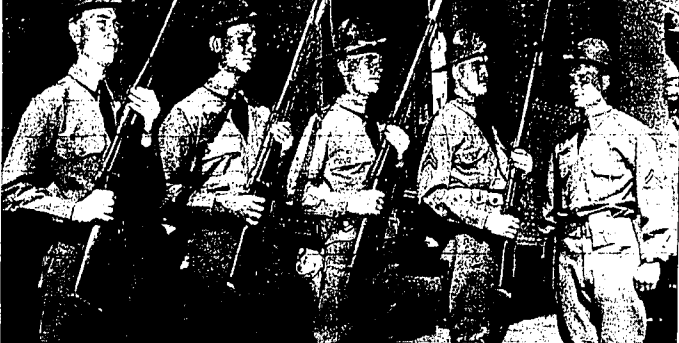

REGISTRARS TALK OF DUTIES HERE

Speakers Stress Importance of Vital Statistics Records

Increasing importance of the work done by registrars of vital statistics because of complexities of modern civilization was stressed during yesterday's all-day meeting of southern Idaho registrars at the Idaho Power company auditorium.

Communities represented at the session included Shoshone, Halley, Burley, Bluff and Twin Falls. Decisions regarding formal talks, registrars engaged in round-table discussion and had luncheon at Wray's cafe.

Mrs. G. Atwood, director of the bureau of vital statistics at Boise, spoke upon the most increase in deaths has occurred in bureau activities, pointing out that there are now as many requests received monthly as during a year's time formerly.

State Statistician Clyde A. Hediger discussed the values of records as such as in establishing legacies to old state and federal government in health and other work, and in assuring the average citizen that he may establish the time and place of his birth.

He revealed that 225,000 birth certificates are now on record at the Boise bureau.

Dr. L. C. Kretschmer, director of the south central district health unit, spoke upon the value of registration of births and deaths from the viewpoint of the health and vice. Also speaking was Dr. Eckerzell, Ribby, secretary of the Idaho Funeral Service association, who told of the value of registration for the funeral director.

During discussion the group advocated new legislation in certain phases of birth and death registration and also talked of deaths without medical attention, delayed registration, current registration and laws governing cemetery associations.

IDAHOAN FLAYS WALLACE STAND

Thomas Criticizes Secretary's Position on Sugar Industry

WASHINGTON, D. C., Aug. 3 (AP)—In the opinion of Senator Thomas (R-Idaho) the attitude of Secretary Wallace toward the sugar industry will not commend him to the voters of the west as a candidate for the office.

In a statement released through the Republican national committee, Senator Thomas said that he had the present administration attempts to destroy the American sugar industry.

He quoted a dispatch from the recent Havana conference of southern American republics which represented the delegates as having urged "a complete re-examination of the sugar beeta, who would be left with the alternatives of finding jobs with the WPA or joining the army."

Discussing a statement attributed to Secretary Wallace that the American sugar industry should be classified as "inefficient," the senator remarked that:

"When the domestic sugar industry can show a profit to the federal treasury of over \$25,000,000 and sugar prices to the consumer are lower than at any time since 1932, it hardly deserves to be classified as 'inefficient.'"

"I doubt," he added, "that the sectors from my constituents with the president that Secretary Wallace's views entitle him to promote the second most important post in the federal government."

DE VINCI BOWS TO WEATHER MAN

Hair Proves to Be Better Method of Measuring Humidity in Air

By FRANK EWING
 NEW YORK, Aug. 3 (AP)—Leonard De Vinci and Dr. James W. Kimball battled step by step to determine who was the better weatherman—and Kimball won by a hair's breadth.

By a hair's breadth is correct. For Kimball, New York City's meteorologist, uses a human hair to measure the amount of moisture in the air.

And Leonardo, the Florentine genius who 450 years ago took time out from his paintings to deal with mechanical problems, used a human hair to gauge the moisture and temperature to the sweaty Italian populace. "It's not the heat, it's the humidity,"

"Where's a bit about which method was better, the new or the old?" said a scientist and industry lord Dr. Kimball said 70 hours to the roof of the AEC building, there's a weathering device, at him and his hair. Kimball put the hair after his observations stratified these two methods.

The De Vinci was—a measured bit of cotton chloride (an absorbent salt) is placed in scales balanced with an equal weight of sand and permitted to absorb moisture until the weight of which is recorded. This rate of humidity then is computed by taking into account temperature, time exposure and evaporation factors.

The Kimball way—a human hair is extremely sensitive to moisture in that it expands when wet and contracts when dry, forms the principal part of a hygrometer. This intricate device records the amount of expansion and thus supplies data from which the humidity is determined.

Kimball's method was considered much quicker and infinitely less tedious.

Working on his hair, the New York prognosticator was charitable to De Vinci. He said, "De Vinci's method is not obsolete and could be used today in case of necessity and just in practical matters. His method just takes longer and doesn't respond quite so quickly, that's all."

Kimball was asked to take reading from Leonardo's humidity contraption, so down to the scales where models of the genius' other inventions, fresh from Italy, are on display and figure out the humidity there.

He mopped his brow and declined, saying, "It's not the humidity. It's the heat."

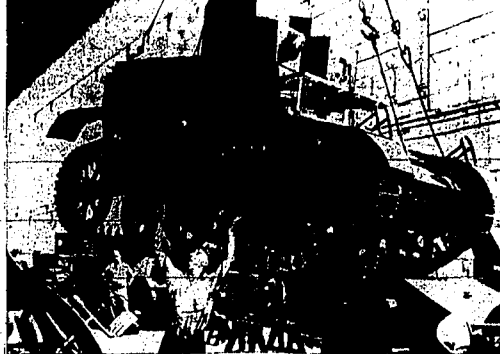

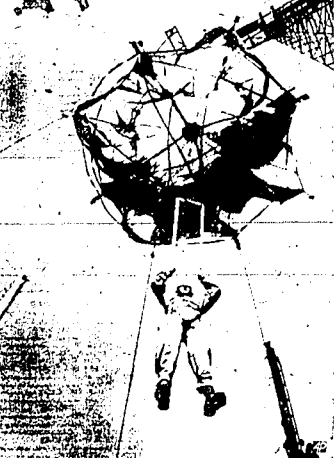

STOCK BROKERS AWAIT INVASION

Market Ends Week of Recovery with Gains, Losses Evenly Split

Markets At A Glance

NEW YORK, Aug. 3.—The stock market today closed out of a fall-steady recovery with minor gains and losses about evenly split. The market was characterized by a definite trend in the brief session that was attributed to brokers partly by the desire for traders to get work reasonably clear over the week-end on the thought that might indicate his long-entrenched "all out" attitude on England.

Reluctance of speculative forces to invest in stocks also was blamed on the desire for more light on the forward business picture and the market's reaction to the news of a congress in Wellington. Some nervousness was evidenced in the result of hearing British-Japanese tension.

The Associated Press average of 80 stocks was unchanged at 42.9. Transfers amounted to 121,000 shares. U. S. Steel and Bethlehem slipped as next week's mill operations were expected to show a small drop due to a number of plants for repairs.

General Motors and Chrysler were a shared favorite among investors as sales of new cars were highly satisfactory and actual manufacture of new 1941 models was to get underway after shut-downs for change-over.

Next week's primary will draw the bids in counties for 54 congressional, state, and county offices to be filled in the general election in November.

Members will select one United States senator, two congressmen, eight state senators, 44 congressmen, 20 representatives, possible 64 counties with sufficient population to elect them in another 10 representatives on ahead and vote on them 88 congressmen, and 44 senators, congressmen, treasury, highway, superintendents of public instruction, excises and attorneys and 31 congressmen, some counties not electing the latter.

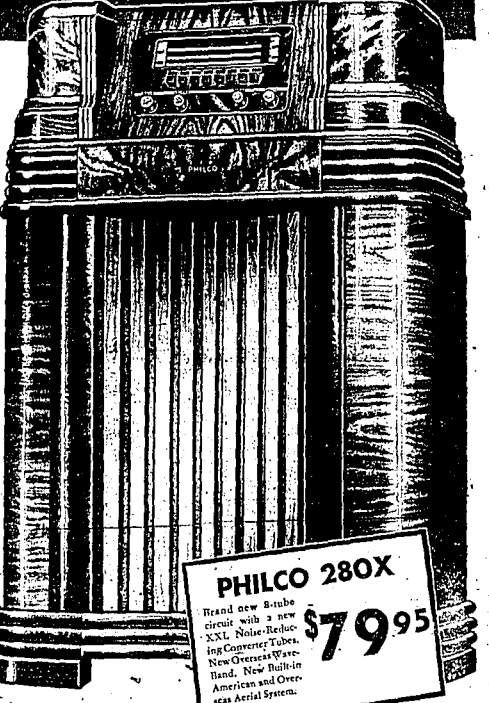
