'GERMAN HOUR' ON STATION BANNED

Radio Corporation Decides to Cancel Controversial Broadcasts

CHICAGO, Aug. 7 (AP)—Directors of radio station WHIP announced they had decided to ban daily "German hour" broadcasts because they deemed the programs "controversial" in nature and "unacceptable to many leading Americans."

The owner of the Hammond, Ind., station, the Hammond-Columbus Broadcasting corporation, notified the sponsor, the German-American National Alliance, that it could not use the station's facilities after next Saturday.

"This action is taken because the 'German hour' as now being presented is of such controversial nature as to make it unacceptable to many leading Americans," the letter of notification set forth. "In view of the present national emergency growing out of the international situation, we believe wholly inadvisable in promoting American solidarity and unity."

Paul A. F. Wernholz, chairman of the public relations committee on public relations, contended in a formal statement: "We are certain that the public will agree that the throttling of the channels of free speech is not in accord with the American way of life. We know that tremendous pressure has been brought to bear upon station WHIP, not by the public, but by certain interests whose main objective is to get us into the war."

He said that speeches made during the program "dealt with our efforts to keep America out of war and free from entangling alliances" and that nothing had been advanced to justify such a course.

Wernholz told reporters that the program had been broadcast for three or four months, that 90 per cent of the time was devoted to music.

IDAHO CANDIDATE APPROVES DRAFT

Frank Keenan Declares Conscriptio Only Course Open to U.S.

BOISE, Aug. 7 (AP)—Conscription is the only course open to us if an effective national defense is to be provided for the United States, Frank J. Keenan of Boise, candidate for the Democratic nomination for second district congressman, said in a press statement here today.

Criticizing opponents of the conscription act pending before the United States senate, Keenan charged that delay in enacting the measure "is a serious blow to the future safety and security of the United States and the western hemisphere."

"The nation, he predicted, would be forced to turn to conscription, in order to recruit an effective defense force. He added he was 'incensed' that the volunteer plan advocated in some quarters would be the answer to the defense problem."

"Although we are all striving to avoid war," he went on, "as a father I prefer that my sons, when and if they are called upon to face an enemy, be equipped and trained so that they may well understand what lies ahead. I believe, an immediate national defense program, based upon conscription, is the fairest and most equitable course to follow."

"There should be no distinction between wealth and poverty. National defense, now, is our greatest assurance against war."

Keenan, who has three sons of military age, left Boise today for Dallas and Fort Worth, where he expects to spend the latter part of the week in the Idaho Falls section, returning here next Monday.

Carl L. DeLong, rate expert for the public utilities commission said today.

DeLong, in charge of vegetable and fruit rates for the Idaho commission was advised from Washington that the ICC had turned down the carriers' application to add six cents per hundredweight on such shipments.

The ruling, he said, would also apply to the railroads' efforts to increase rates by a like amount on shipments to the same markets from Colorado, Wyoming, Utah, Nevada and eastern Oregon.

Credit for the "favorable direction for the growers," he said, "should be given to the growers and shippers association of Idaho and to the public utilities commission."

The eastern territory affected by the ruling, he added, represents the market for about 50 per cent of the finest quality of potatoes we can produce."
