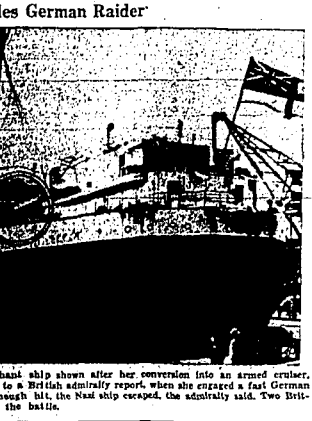

GOING TO GET BOYS' DORMITORY

Governor Studies Bond Issue for \$100,000 Structure

BOISE, Aug. 9.—A \$100,000 boys' dormitory at the Gooding state school for deaf and blind is to be constructed as directed by the 1939 legislature, Governor Bottelstein announced today.

Bottelstein said plans already were being drawn up by Toucheville and Hummel, Boise architects for the dormitory, to accommodate 100 boys.

Provision for the dormitory was made in 1939 emergency act which directed the governor to federal funds could be obtained—to have issued \$100,000 in bonds for buildings at the Gooding school, the state hospital north at Orofino, state hospital south at Blackfoot, and the state historical society at Boise.

If federal money was not available, the law prescribed the bonds are to be issued anyway, \$100,000 spent for the dormitory and the remainder divided among the other state institutions at the governor's discretion.

Although the act was to have been carried out at once, Bottelstein has delayed in hope of receiving federal funds, but was informed by Representative Diamond (R-Idaho) there was no immediate prospect.

State Treasurer Myrtle P. Eakin, on advice of Attorney General J. W. Taylor, has refused to issue any of the bonds unless all are issued.

Bottelstein said he was working out details of the building deal, but declined to say how the extra \$100,000 would be secured outside the act.

He has maintained the amount would not be sufficient to build adequate buildings.

Plans for the dormitory call for a two-story brick building with the roof of fireproof construction, 187 feet long and 49 1/2 feet deep of modern colonial architecture to conform with present campus buildings.

There will be quarters for four house mothers. Three-fourths of the dormitory is to be for deaf students the remainder for the blind.

FIMES END LIFE OF CALM KILER

Robert Bergunder, Confessed Slayer, 'Takes It Like a Man'

FLORENCE, Ariz., Aug. 9.—Robert Bergunder made a last-minute confession and was sentenced to life in prison for the slaying of Phoenix automobile salesman, but was taken down in state prison and gas chamber to die for the crime.

"I admit the killing. I never had a defense lawyer," Bergunder said as attendants strapped him to one of the wooden chairs in the chamber.

The 33-year-old "problem" college student, who lived E. H. Cocks' room and Bill W. Keyser in the desert near Phoenix and killed as they lay bound at his feet, arose nonchalantly into the execution chamber, but chewed gum to hide his nervousness.

He realized his wish, expressed soon after his arrest in May, 1939, to be able "to take it like a man." He breathed bravely as the electric current ran from a container into his eyes and he was dropped, and was pronounced dead in 30 minutes.

Bergunder, who blamed his downfall on gambling, had said from the beginning that he desired to die rather than spend many years in prison.

Records of the state board of pardons and paroles revealed that in Arizona history to die without acknowledgment for clemency. He agreed to the appeal of his case to the state supreme court only at the insistence of his mother, Mrs. W. P. Bergunder, of Alhambra, Calif., who died, grief-stricken, last spring.

Bergunder's death returned from the original story to newspapermen and officers while being returned from Tennessee, where he was captured a week after the killings. On the return from Tennessee, Bergunder's statement said the actual slaying was a companion whom he refused to name.

The body was sent to Phoenix for cremation and the ashes will be taken to Seattle for burial.

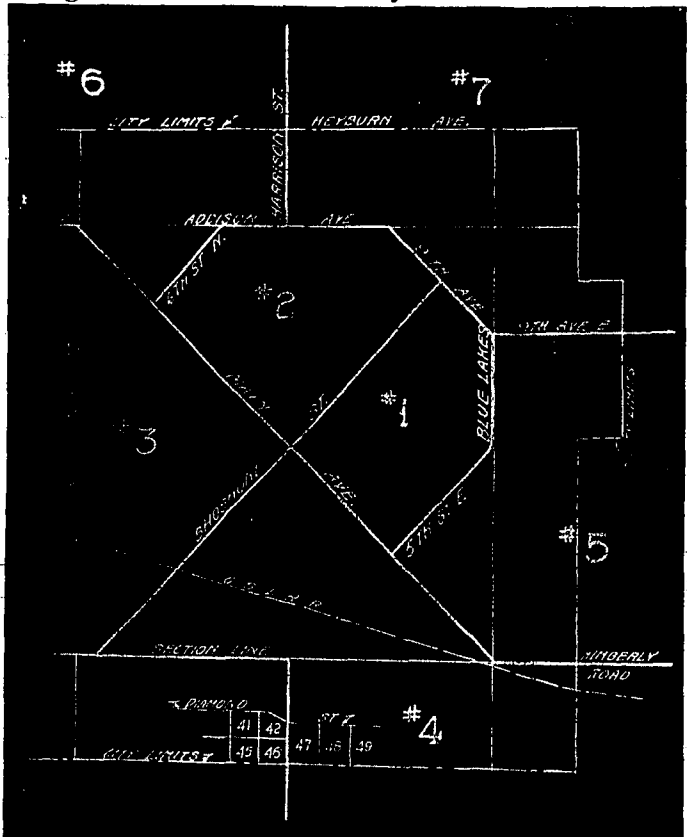

Organization Plans Purchase of 2,000 Negatives in Rare Collection

A more to retain the C. E. Byrnes collection of historical photographic negatives in Twin Falls is in progress today as result of action taken during yesterday's luncheon meeting of the chamber of commerce at the Heersoon hotel.

Mr. Byrnes, pioneer photographer of the Twin Falls tract, died before the session to explain that, although the rare collection is valued at \$500, it could be purchased by the chamber for \$1,000. The negatives, made over a period of 34 years, number 2,000.

Mr. Byrnes pointed out that he has no relatives who could inherit the collection.

Other action of the chamber included a discussion of a "one day sale" on the directional sign near Rupert which points the way to the town. The sign is being replaced by one showing the town's location effected by enforcement of the state law forbidding such "reminders" on the public highways.

Perry Moss, Prominent Rancher, Dies Following Long Illness

JEROME, Aug. 9.—Perry S. Moss, 63, prominent Jerome farmer, died at 2:30 p. m. today at his home northwest of here, following a prolonged illness.

Funeral services will be held Sunday at 2 p. m. at the L.D.S. church at McCammon and burial will be in the cemetery there under direction of the Moss family, home of Jerome.

U.S. BEAN CROP RECORD FORESEEN

Agriculture Department Report Indicates Third Largest Harvest

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9.—A prospective bean crop of about 14,000,000 bushels, the largest in 15 years, was indicated today in the August 1 crop report of the agriculture department.

The 1939 harvest was 13,962,000 bushels and the 1922-23 average 13,000,000.

The crop reporting board said planting was rather late in some states, but growth was generally good to excellent in July and in most districts good yields per acre were expected.

The Aug. 1 indicated yield per acre was 827 pounds, 21 pounds above a month ago but 61 pounds less than 1928.

In the principal producing states, the 1939 harvest and the indicated 1940, respectively, included: Idaho 1,251,000 and 1,846,000.
